Composition Coordinator / Assistant Chairperson for Composition, NJCU (2010-2016; fall 2018)

Spearheaded the development and implementation of a new Composition Curriculum, implementing Accelerated Learning Program classes to replace developmental classes in order for underprepared students, ap -year students each year, to move more swiftly through their requirements with more intensive, student-centered pedagogy. Analyzed student results each semester and longitudinally. Worked closely with administration to meet enrollment and retention goals and increase student success rates.

Opened the inaugural NJCU Writing Center in September 2008, fostering its growth over eight years, from an opening staff of a dozen tutors to a full roster of 30 tutors, ranging in experience from interns enrolled in English 400 and peer tutors to graduate and professional tutors. Served every college in the University, offering up to 30 customized workshops, designed with instructors for specific classes and exams; a variety of conversational English and capstone working groups; and up to 2800 individual appointments per year.

Hired and trained multi-level tutoring staff from peer interns to professionals.

Created PR materials, hosted outreach events, and publicized Center services.
